Information on Rights

You have the right to request access to your personal data, its correction or deletion, restriction of processing, the right to object, and the right to lodge a complaint with the Office for Personal Data Protection.

The data subject has the right to obtain confirmation as to whether their personal data is being processed, and if so, access to such data and information regarding its processing (purpose, categories of data, recipients, storage duration, etc.).

The data subject has the right to request the correction of inaccurate data or the supplementation of incomplete data.

The data subject may request the deletion of personal data, for example when:

- 1. The data is no longer necessary,
- 2. Consent has been withdrawn and no other legal basis for processing exists,
- 3. The data has been processed unlawfully.

The data subject may also request that the controller temporarily restrict the processing of personal data, for example if the accuracy or the lawfulness of the processing is being contested.

The data subject has the right to obtain their personal data in a structured, commonly used, and machine-readable format and to transmit it to another controller (e.g. when changing service providers).

The data subject has the right to object at any time to the processing of personal data based on the controller's legitimate interest or for direct marketing purposes.

The data subject has the right not to be subject to a decision based solely on automated processing if such decision has legal or similarly significant effects on them.

If personal data processing is based on consent, the data subject may withdraw their consent at any time.

The data subject has the right to lodge a complaint with the Office for Personal Data Protection.
